Lost in the middle of the Antarctic Ocean, over 13000 km from the French coasts, Crozet, Kerguelen and Amsterdam are so isolated that they can only be reached by sea - even today. Noone has ever lived there on a permanent basis... if you don't count those who were shipwrecked or who came in chase of some wild dreams. However, the rugged shores became the backdrop to a true tale of adventure: the story of the Kerguelen knight who thought he'd found the new Eldorado; the land of seal and whale hunters, of explorers, of industrialists wanting to « colonise » otherwise barren islands. Ruins, shipwrecks and logbooks tell a story: that of an ever-lasting fascination for these islands that remain aloof to protect their mystery.

Through surprising encounters - "The Plankton E.T.", voracious bacteria or penguins, inventors of vocal locks - we discover these "southern sentinels" who, by alerting us about the consequences of our modern way of life, help us to think about the future of the planet.
