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Forty years after its inauguration (January 31, 1977, the Centre Georges-Pompidou in Paris is undoubtedly a success: a popular success with over 180 million visitors since its opening - be it for the building itself, for its public library, for its museum, its temporary exhibitions, its auditoriums, its restaurant on the roofs of Paris... The Pompidou Centre, or Beaubourg as it's known locally, is much loved. Museums from all over the world have followed the example, from the Guggenheim in Bilbao to the Kunsthaus in Graz via the Pompidou Centre in Metz.
