We continue our 'Tour de France' in the second series of major construction works and visit, among others, the largest European 'techno pole' - Sophia Antipolis - in the South of France, an ambitious project aiming to become "the Florence of the 21st century".

Another city - American this time -was newly constructed near Paris - Disneyland ® Paris, Mickey's dream city.

Strasburg as well has done major works when the tramway was built in the middle of the 1990s.
